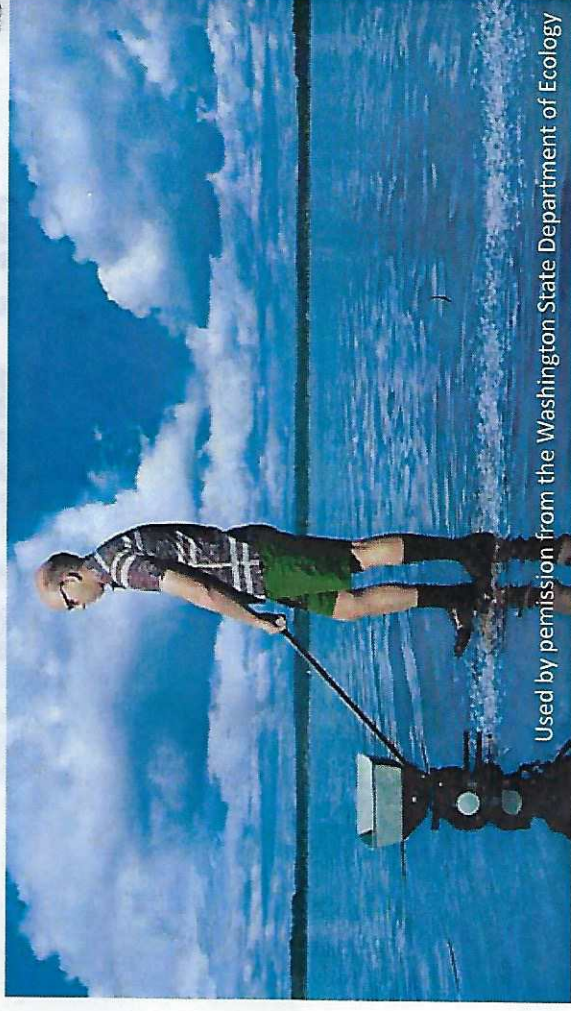

The My Brevard Yard program teaches you how to create and maintain a beautiful lawn while minimizing pollutants that enter our waterways.

You will learn how to:

- figure out how much fertilizer to apply to your lawn,
- what kind of fertilizer will give you the healthiest lawn,
- decide the best time to apply fertilizer,
- calculate how long to run your sprinkler system, and
- maintain a healthy lawn while complying with your local fertilizer ordinance.

One or three-hour workshops are available. The 3-hour workshop is great for municipalities, homeowner associations, and other large groups.

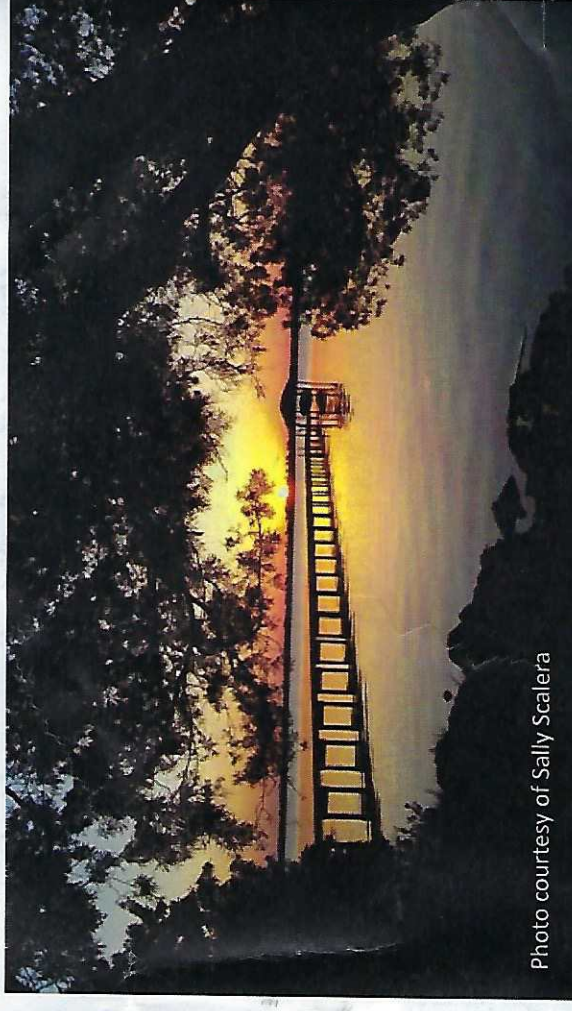
