Based on your prior input: "As far as the ditch cleaning: the **1,520' was from our crews cleaning 11 different ditches**. Our dump truck has a 10 yd capacity so we picked up and haul out approximately 370 cubic yards of material "

Please open the "City of DeBary regional Watersheds" figure, and refer to the basin highlighted in blue, which depicts the drainage area that discharges into Lake Monroe.

We need to determine if any of the 370 cubic yards of material was collected from that drainage basin. If so, what is the length of the ditch(es) please?

We cannot take credit for the 370 cy of materials collected but only for the amount of materials collected within the drainage basin that actually discharges into Lake Monroe.

This is a time-sensitive request by FDEP. Your prompt attention to this request is most appreciated.

Apologies. After I input DeBary's numbers into the records for credits, I realized that DeBary had reduced their starting load with two non-contributing basins (basins 4 and 5). With that, they are only eligible for the portion of the starting load that is considered to be within the contributing basins. Additionally, I need to know how many BMP clean outs they have and what portion, if any, are within the non-contributing basins as they would not be eligible for credit on those. Attached is an updated credit workbook which shows the non-contributing basins that were claimed versus the starting loads as well as all of the project documentation for their education credits.

The City of DeBary has this Code of Ordinance:

Sec. 10-50. - Removal of animal waste.

(a)The owner of every animal shall be responsible for the removal of any excreta deposited by his or her animal on public walks, recreation areas or private property other than his or her own.

(b)Any person found in violation of this section is subject to the penalties prescribed in section 10-32.

Sec. 10-32. - Penalty.

A violation of this article is a civil infraction which carries a maximum civil penalty not to exceed \$500.00. If a person who has committed such a civil infraction does not contest a citation issued to him or her, the civil penalty shall be less than the maximum civil penalty. Any expenses imposed on the owner of an animal by operation of this article which remain unpaid as of the time of judicial handling shall be ordered paid as a part of the court's disposition. The city also may seek payment of outstanding expenses as restitution in any companion or related criminal prosecution. In the event of a violation of F.S. ch. 767 or F.S. § 828.29, the owner shall be subject to applicable criminal penalties in addition to any civil penalties. Further, nothing herein shall relieve the owner of civil liability for injuries or damages which result from actions or inactions that are violations of the provisions herein.
