Dear Ms. Sutton,

I have been a Brevard county resident for 17 years. I am writing to ask you to have the state of Florida DEP be the first in the nation to set limits on toxic algae in water and to set recommendations for how often to test our waters. Once every 3 years is not often enough. Water is life, and we have seen fish kills and sick animals because of polluted waters. The toxins have been linked to liver disease and neurological disorders in people.

I care deeply about the Florida environment. I feel I am doing my part in saving our local land by working on the Board of Hundred Acre Hollows, Inc, a non-profit caring for 114 acres of Brevard County land. Our mission is to Protect the Wildlife, Restore the Habitat, and Engage the Public. Hundred Acre Hollows is located one half mile from the Indian River Lagoon. I feel by keeping the land with grasses and trees and wildlife, we are helping not further pollute the groundwater and not cause more run-off to the IRL. www.hundredacrehollows.org

Please set limits on toxic blue-green algae in Florida waters and have the water tested more than once every 3 years.
