Congressman Mast says:

US EPA stated that anything about 8 parts per billion of microcystin is unsafe for human contact. In 2018, measured levels in our community reached as high as 495 parts per billion - more than 60 times what is safe for human contact!

So he thinks there is a potential tightening of standards? That must be the answer.

I think you should move the FDEP out of Tallahassee and over to Clewiston.
A nice central location where you would have firsthand knowledge of the problem.

Time for studies is over. Building swales out of sand to contain water?

How about dredging a canal around the shallow northeast side of the lake, removing the contaminants and barging it back up the Kissimmee?

It can be used to build water detention swales in the landscape that allow containment of the cattle excrement for purification.

The water depth on the west quarter of the lake is under 2 feet when the east side has 12 feet. Acres of water storage is available right on the lake.

Please direct all funds to actual construction work. No more studies.
