CONSENSUS RULES

- DECISIONS CAN ONLY BE MADE AT MEETINGS AT WHICH A QUORUM IS PRESENT.
- A QUORUM IS DEFINED AS A MAJORITY OF THE OVERALL VOTING MEMBERSHIP. (50% PLUS 1)
- EVERY ATTEMPT WILL BE MADE TO MAKE DECISIONS BY CONSENSUS
- VOTING WILL BE USED ONLY IF CONSENSUS CANNOT BE REACHED IN A REASONABLE AMOUNT OF TIME
- CONSENSUS IS DEFINED AS EVERYONE HAVING NO LESS THAN 3 FINGERS SHOWING DURING A RANKING
- IF A VOTE IS NECESSARY, A MAJORITY OF VOTING REPRESENTATIVES PRESENT WILL BE REQUIRED TO PASS AN ITEM.
- CONSENSUS SHOWN AS FOLLOWS WITH A SHOW OF FINGERS:
 - o 5 FINGERS MEANS WHOLEHEARTED SUPPORT
 - o 4 FINGERS MEANS SUPPORT
 - o 3 FINGERS MEANS NEUTRAL BUT WILL SUPPORT FULLY TO OUTSIDE WORLD
 - o 2 FINGERS MEANS YOU STILL HAVE QUESTIONS YOU NEED TO ASK
 - o 1 FINGER BLOCKS ANY DECISION (NO MIDDLE FINGERS!!)

In the event anyone has a show of 1 or 2 fingers, discussion will continue to answer questions or concerns of those blocking. If there are no 1's or 2's, then consensus is reached on that issue and you will move on to the next issue to be discussed.
