

Facilities Terms and Definitions

OVERNIGHT AREAS

Bathhouse	Facility which include showers, toilets and sinks usually in campgrounds but can also be in swimming areas.
Boat Campground	Mooring areas or docks which allow boaters to pull in designated sites and camp onboard their boats
Boat Campsites	Number of moorings or boat slips in the boat campground.
Campfire Circle	Area with an established fire ring and constructed seating around a fire ring
Campground	A developed area to support recreational vehicles (RV), trailers, pop-up campers and tents and could provide the following list of amenities: water connections, electricity connections, centralized showers, restrooms, dump station, picnic tables, campfire ring and/or grill; may include sewer hook-ups and other amenities
Camping Platform	Raised platform used for tent camping, maybe covered or screened.
Campsite	Site within campground dedicated for RV or tent.
Electric 30 Amp	Campsite with 30 amp electrical connection.
Electric 50 Amp	Campsite site with 50 amp electrical connection.
Non-electric	Campsite site with no electrical connection.
Developed Group Camp	Overnight accommodation for organized groups which typically consists of primitive cabins, restrooms, dining hall, recreation hall, open-air pavilions and office/infirmarary/staff quarters building. These facilities are usually rented for church retreats, family reunions, corporate retreats and youth camp programs (e.g. Wekiwa Springs, O’Leno, Hugh Taylor Birch)
Dump Station	Area accepting recreational vehicle waste.
Equestrian Campground	Area designated for equestrian camping.
Equestrian Campsite	Sites within an equestrian campground designated for equestrian use only.
Historic Cabin	Historic CCC cabins available for rental (e.g. Myakka River, O'Leno, Gold Head Branch).
Laundry Building	Stand-alone laundry facility.
Lodge	Building with multiple fully-furnished rooms for overnight stay having self-contained bathrooms; includes dining area (e.g. Wakulla Springs).
Primitive Cabin	A rental unit designed primarily as a sleeper cabin which does not have self-contained bathroom or kitchen facilities. Usually furnished with cots, table, and chairs. Often located in group camps with centralized bathhouses.
Primitive Campground	An area designated for camping with only limited or no improvements such as a fire ring, cleared or partially cleared sites for tent camping, and if possible, potable water. Accessible by foot, bicycle or canoe/kayak only.
Primitive Campsite	A camp site with limited or no improvements.
Primitive Group Camp	An established campground designed for use by organized groups; typically includes restroom or pit toilets, fire circle and large tent campground (formally known as Youth Camp)
Restroom	Typically include toilets and sinks with running water, but no shower facilities usually outside camp areas, but sometimes in primitive group camp
Restroom - Primitive	Toilet with no running water.
Tent Only Site	Site within campground dedicated for tents only; usually has water and electricity.
Vacation Cabin	A rental unit having a self-contained kitchen, at least one bathroom and bedroom; always include water and electricity; typically include central heating and cooling , linens and kitchen utensils/appliances.

DAY USE AREAS

Arbor	Structures adorned with vegetation for decoration and cover.
Bar-B-Q Shelter	A roofed cooking area with a built-in BBQ pit.
Commemorative Site	Site, structure or monument commemorating a person, event, industry, etc.
Concession	Building used by and for concessions.
Cultural Site	Site with cultural significance.
Environmental Education Center	Facility built to provide educational activities, class rooms, laboratory space, etc.
Fort	Historical fort.
Garden	Site which has been intensively landscaped, usually in a formal manner, to provide aesthetic enjoyment.
Gazebo	Roofed, decorative structure.
Historic Building	Building that has purely historic uses.
Kiosk	Roofed structured to display of information.
Museum	Facility built to provide interpretive displays, exhibits or programs about a specific event, individual, activity, etc
National Register Site	A site, structure or item listed on the U.S. Department of the Interior’s National Register of Historic Places. Properties listed in the Register include districts, sites, buildings, structures, and objects that are significant in American history, architecture, archeology, engineering, or culture.
Observation Platform	Platform not attached to building, for the purpose of observation.

Observation Tower	Stand alone elevated tower for observation.
Parking Areas	Count paved and unpaved areas. Do not count temporary or over-flow areas not normally used for visitor parking
Parking Spaces	Count for paved and unpaved areas. Do not count spaces in temporary or over-flow areas not normally used for visitor parking
Paved Road	Any road that has been improved with a paving material such as; asphalt, concrete, brick or composite.
Picnic Pavillion Large	Open air shelter with 12-16 6' picnic tables.
Picnic Pavillion Medium	Open air shelter with 8-12 6' picnic tables.
Picnic Pavillion Small	Open air shelter with 4-8 6' picnic tables.
Playground	Structure designed specifically for children's recreational entertainment.
Stabilized Road	Any road that had been marginally improved with a material such as; crushed limestone, gravel, recycled asphalt/concrete/rubber.
Underwater Observatory	Area allowing under water viewing.
Visitor Center	Facility built to provide general interpretive information about the park’s natural and cultural resources, recreation activities, etc.

TRAILS

Biking Trail	Trail designated for only riding a bicycle. Can be paved or unpaved.
Canoe/Kayak Trail	Designated trail for canoeing or kayaking in freshwater or saltwater.
Equestrian Trail	Designated trail for horseback riding only.
Fitness Trail	Trail with exercise (parcours) stations.
Florida National Scenic Trail	Portion of the park’s hiking trails designated as a segment of the Florida National Scenic Trail.
Hiking Trail	Designated specifically for walking distances more than one mile, includes backpacking.
Nature Trail	Short walking trail less than 1 mile through a natural area.
Shared Use Trail	Trail that can accommodate more than one use at a time. Shared use trail types include hiking/bicycle, hiking/equestrian, and hiking/bicycle/equestrian.
Trailhead	Area designated for access to park trails; typically includes parking area and informational kiosk.

WATERFRONT AREAS

Beach	Freshwater and saltwater shoreline.
Boardwalk	Raised platform intended for transportation over water and/or ecologically sensitive areas.
Boat Ramp	Improved (paved) and unimproved (sand, gravel) ramps designed for launching motor boats.
Boathouse	Covered boat slip.
Canoe/Kayak Launch	Designated launches designed for putting canoes or kayaks in freshwater or saltwater.
Designated Swimming Areas	A designated area of up to 300' where persons can enter the water for swimming. May include a specific water area designated by floating ropes or other marking devices, restroom or bathhouse, picnic facilities and may include a sunning area. Freshwater swimming areas: Include all lakes, rivers, and springs. Saltwater swimming areas: number should reflect number of beach access points (boardwalks, trails, etc.).
Fishing Jetty	A structure of stones, piles, or the like projecting into the water used for fishing.
Fishing Platform	Raised platform providing access to fishable waters; differs from a pier in that it connects with the shore in multiple locations
Fixed Dock	Dock that is fixed and rigid.
Floating Dock	Dock that is floating and free to move with water levels, non-rigid.
Jetty	A structure of stones, piles, or the like projecting into the water.
Lighthouse	Vertical structure that may be used as aid to navigation.
Marina	Area with docks and boat slips; typically provides restrooms and overnight boat camping.
Pier	an elevated structure projecting into the water; typically used for fishing.
Shower Station	Stand alone shower; typically found in swimming areas.

OTHER FACILITIES

Animal Enclosure	Pen or shelter for animals.
Barn	Enclosed area designed for animals.
Cistern	Rain water storage facility.
Corral	Undivided fenced area used for containing animals.
Deck	An uncovered flat structure usually attached to a building..
Dining Hall	Area designed for eating, includes attached kitchen.
Entrance Sign	Sign marking entrance of park.

Honor Box	Fixture for collecting fees, unattended.
Other - Agency	Building managed by another agency (city, state, federal).
Other - Private	Building managed by a private entity (non-concessioner).
Paddock	Open air divided enclosure for animals not roofed.
Porch	A covered flat structure usually attached to a building.
Ranger Station	Park entrance is controlled, fees are collected, parking spaces, park information, park offices.
Recreation Hall	Building designed for recreational activities other than eating.
Shelter	Covered, open air area with no specific purpose.
Shelter - Enclosed	Shelter enclosed primarily with screen.
Shelter - Waiting	Shelter dedicated for waiting, such as a tram waiting area or tour waiting area.
Stable	Open air divided enclosure for animals, roofed with stalls.
Stage	Platform for entertainment purposes.
Toll Booth	Small building where you pay a park entrance fee.

SUPPORT AREAS

Greenhouse	Enclosed area for plants that does not maintain same temperature as surrounding air at all times.
Lift Station	For pumping waste to a different location.
Nursery	Area dedicated to plant growth, no climate control as a greenhouse.
Office	Administrative area, ranger station, district offices, etc.
Pumphouse	Structure enclosing well water pump facility.
Residence	Staff housing.
Shade House	Structure providing shade for plants, no climate control.
Shop	Structure designed for maintenance of park vehicles and equipment.
Storage	Building for multi purpose storage.
Storage - Chemical/Flammable	Storage for chemicals and flammable materials.
Storage - Equipment	Storage for vehicles and equipment/pole barn.
Unstabilized Road	Any road on natural soil surface without any additional material added (e.g. jeep trail) .
Water Treatment Plant	For treatment of water for consumption.
