NOTES: **Mandatory city water hookup; Sec. 25-44. - Duty to connect to city water. (a) All dwellings or places of business in the city shall be required to connect to the city water main when within two hundred (200) feet of such main.**

Sec. 25-51. - Wells prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person, company or other entity to use, maintain or construct open wells, dig wells, or any other non-potable water supply within the corporate limits of the City of Madison, in the City of Madison's industrial park, and on any property which is subject to or governed by the Code of Ordinances of the city.
