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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

(12/12/05 revision)

The City of Jacksonville received an Electronic Products Collection and Recycling Grant on Dec. 9, 2002, for \$50,000 under the Florida Department of Environmental Protection Agreement No. S0067. The grant will expire Dec. 31, 2005.

Collection and Recycling

The city began accepting E-Waste at remote collection sites as early as Nov. 16, 2002. Forty-five (45) remote collections were held from Nov. 16, 2002, to Sept. 30, 2005. Starting in January 2003 to December 2005, the Household Hazardous Waste Facility (HHWF) accepted E-Waste six (6) days a week, except on Sundays and holidays.

Citizen Participation

From November 2002 to December 2005, two thousand six hundred and twenty five nineteen (2,625) people participated in the remote collections, resulting in eighty two (82) tons of E-Waste collected.

One hundred and thirty-three (133) of those participants were surveyed, and indicated that:

- 59% participated because of the convenience of the remote site locations; others because they are concerned about the environment and didn't know where to take E-Waste.
- \$6.59 is the average price a citizen would pay for E-Waste disposal.
- 48% would be willing to pay a disposal fee when an item is purchased; 38% when recycled.
- A home has an average of 2 TVs, 3 computer monitors and 3 CPUs (central processing unit).
- 65% thought the government should operate the E-waste collection program; others suggested retailers and/or manufacturers do the collection program.

It is evident that the \$6,000 investment for newspaper advertisements improved citizen awareness of the Household Hazardous Waste Program based on the following participation data:

- FY 02/03: 8,267 (including 406 E-Waste collection participants at remote sites)
- FY03/04: 9,294 - 12% increase (Including 371 E-Waste collection participants at remote sites)
- FY04/05: 10,395 - 26% increase (including 574 E-Waste collection participants at remote sites)

Disbursement

\$43811.14 of the grant has been expended as of the end of November 2005. Another shipment of E-waste in December 1, 2005 for de-manufacturing and recycling is estimated to incur an additional expenditure of less than \$1,000.00. The final request for reimbursement will be submitted before December 31, 2005.

Plans

The collection and recycling of E-Waste is currently an integral part of the City of Jacksonville Household Hazardous Waste Program.

Six (6) future remote collections are scheduled between January and July 2006.

BACKGROUND

Located in Northeast Florida and nurtured by the majestic St. Johns River, Jacksonville is the largest city in the contiguous United States in land area. Jacksonville covers 841 square miles and is ranked the 14th largest city with more than 800,000 residents.

The Jacksonville metropolitan area, which includes three beach cities (Atlantic, Neptune and Jacksonville) and Clay, Baker, Nassau and St. Johns counties, has a population of more than 1,000,000 residents.

Jacksonville has one of the lowest overall costs of living in Florida and the U.S. -- 92.6 percent of the national average -- with housing and utilities being the best indicator. The median age of Jacksonville residents is 35.3. The average household income is \$50,475 and the median household income is \$40,792.

The City of Jacksonville and Duval County merged in 1968 creating a single entity governing all of Duval County with the exception of the beach communities (Atlantic Beach, Neptune Beach, and Jacksonville Beach) and Baldwin. The city government operates under a mayor as head of the administrative branch and the City Council as the legislative branch. There are 19 city council members, 14 elected to represent geographical districts and five elected at-large.

In 2000, the city and its community made major investments in the Internet and computer technology. In addition, the public/private wireless connectivity initiative, known as "JaxWIZ", is in the process of

developing a Network Access Point. The City Council passed legislation to fund a study that would determine the feasibility of creating a municipally owned, countrywide telecommunications network. The Florida Community College at Jacksonville announced the establishment of the Advance Technology Center with the aim to develop Jacksonville into a hub of Internet and telecommunications activity.

The National Safety Council estimated in 2001 that as many as 500 million computers will become obsolete and disposed of in the next 6 years.

These developments created a challenge for the city to initiate a comprehensive plan to deal with E-Waste as the city and surrounding areas experienced the increasing rate of electronic product turnover due to the accelerated growth of the industry.

The City Council Resolution 2001-0031 tasked the City's Environmental Resource Management Department to schedule special citywide E-Waste collection and recycling days in early 2002, particularly for TVs and computer monitors.

The City sponsored a one-time E-Waste collection event in April 20, 2002. Based upon the success of this one event, it became evident that the community would support an expanded program.

The City applied for and was awarded the FDEP Electronic Products Collection and Recycling Grant on Dec. 9, 2002.

Due to the inability by the E-Waste contractor to secure the required Performance Bond, the contract was not executed until June of 2004.

E-Waste was accepted at remote collection sites as early as Nov. 16, 2002, and at the HHW fixed facility, which is open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., six (6) days a week except Sundays and holidays.

The Environmental Resource Management Department (ERMD) is tasked to manage a comprehensive solid waste management system for Duval County under the provisions of the Chapter 380, Part 1, City Ordinance Code.

Under the ERMD, the Disposal Operations Activity is responsible for providing an environmentally safe means of disposal for various types of solid waste. This includes managing and monitoring the city's open and closed landfills, yard waste processing facilities, household hazardous waste disposal and electronic waste disposal programs.

Duval County residents are encouraged to recycle E-Waste rather than placing them curbside.

Residents can bring E-Waste to the City Household Hazardous Waste Facility at 2675 Commonwealth Ave., (904) 387-7747.

Our mobile collection events have been expanded from collecting basic household hazardous wastes to include the collection of E-Waste.

ELECTRONIC WASTE GRANT PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The City of Jacksonville conducted fourteen (14) remote household hazardous waste collection events annually. The grant application proposed the collection of E-Waste during these remote collection events.

The intent was to use the grant money to help combine the collection, de-manufacturing and recycling of E-waste with the ongoing Household Hazardous Waste Program. Funds from this grant were used primarily to secure a contract with a qualified vendor to handle the sorting, de-manufacturing, recycling and related transportation costs.

Statistics from our one time E-waste collection event held on April 20, 2002, indicated that less than 1 in 1,000 households were being served or were aware of the HHW program. To better educate our citizens and small businesses about the availability of environmentally responsible means to dispose of household hazardous waste and E-Waste, a portion of the grant was spent on advertising in the local newspaper.

A blanket purchase order was activated to pay the vendor prior to the execution of the contract. The execution of the contract was delayed due to the inability of the contractor to provide the required performance bond. Three grant extensions were requested due to the delay in awarding the contract. An E-Waste contract was eventually awarded June 17, 2004.

One remote site collection is scheduled in each of the 14 council districts except in Fiscal Year 2002/3003, when 17 remote collection events were held. City properties, particularly parks, were

chosen to avoid possible liability issues. Schedules were publicized on the city's Web site, pay stubs, newsletters and in the Florida Times-Union. Large signs were procured and set up close to the collection site three (3) days before the event. Flyers were distributed to nearby churches and businesses one week before the event.

Site and equipment layout, loading and staffing plans were developed for each event. The plans were discussed with the staff the Wednesday before the event. The plans were reviewed and/or revised as needed prior to deployment to the site on the day of the event.

City properties were given priority in site selection to prevent liability issues. Large city parks have a trailer with a resident police officer for security. This deters illegal dumping at the site after the remote collection event.

It takes at least one hour to set up a collection site. The site was made open to the public from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Two lanes were provided, one for regular household hazardous chemicals and waste drop off and one lane designated for E-Waste only. This site layout prevented traffic delays, particularly when conducting surveys.

Each site was thoroughly cleaned up at the end of an event. The site was re-visited on the first working day after the event to make sure that household hazardous waste or E-Waste dropped off by late customers is picked-up.

Reusable computers were donated to needy families through JaxWIZ and the Jacksonville Urban League.

The city crew delivers the collected E-Waste to the contractor as needed.

Quarterly reports and reimbursements requests were submitted regularly.

E-Waste will be collected at the Household Hazardous Waste Facility and during the six (6) scheduled remote collection sites in 2006.

Contracted Recycling and De-manufacturing

As of December 9, 2005, \$43, 811.14 of the grant money was spent as follows:

- \$26,269.90 for recycling and de-manufacturing
- \$12295.99 for advertisement
- \$ 5,288.25 for supplies

The City of Jacksonville contributed \$6,071.23 for labor, equipment and maintenance, 50% of the advertisement cost.

CONCLUSION

The grant reinforced the city's initiative to establish a program to include the collection of Electronic Waste (E-Waste) with the regular household hazardous waste.

The grant helped increase the citizen's awareness of the City Household Hazardous Waste Program. This is a major step toward closing the loop in recycling E-Waste.

The project helped recover ferrous and non-ferrous metal like copper and other precious metal. It also reduced landfill space requirement for the disposal of potentially hazardous waste like the cathode ray tubes or CRT from TVs and computer monitors.

The survey results could help legislators and the industry and/or manufacturers to include disposal fee cost when establishing the Product Stewardship Program.

The citizens participate and appreciate remote collection events, particularly those from more affluent neighborhoods.

Remote collection events should not be held during the hot dog days of August and peak hurricane traffic months of September and October.

The inclusion of E-Waste to the Household Hazardous Waste Collection program provided a unique cross-training program for the city crew in the safe handling of E-Waste.

At least three thousand two hundred and thirty (3230) units of televisions and computer monitors containing "RCRA toxicity characteristic lead" were prevented from landfill disposal and were de-manufactured, recycled and/or reused by needy families.

Description of Work Performed

- The Household Hazardous Waste Facility (HHWF) at 2675 Commonwealth Avenue continues to accept E-Waste six days a week, from 8:30 A.M. to 4:00 P.M., except Sundays and Holidays.
- We continued to collect and maintain data to support end of year reports required by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP).
- Thirteen (13) remote collections were held from January 8, 2005 to June 25, 2005.

Problems Encountered and Resolved

- In October 2004, the contractor was paid \$12,151.20 vice \$7,476.78 resulting to an overpayment of \$5,851.20 (see invoices No. 1a and 1b, dated 10/8/04). This



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problem was resolved when the contractor issued a corrected Invoice No. 1a and 1b and a "Credit Invoice No. 2" dated 10/20/04 in the amount of \$5,851.20.

- Credit Invoice No. 2 through Credit Invoice 19b are for the services provided by the contractor from October 25, 2004 through March 12, 2005 which compensated for the overpayment.

Schedule Updates

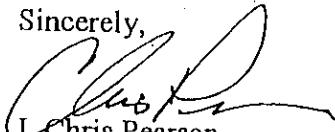
- The fourteen remote collection event (14) for FY 04-05 were completed on July 23, 2005.

1. The Household Hazardous Waste Facility began accepting electronic wastes in October 2002. It is anticipated that the facility will continue to collect electronic wastes.
2. A Request for Proposal for Electronic Waste Collection and Recycling has been drafted but not yet issued at this time. In the interim a Purchase Order was issued to a local service provider to collect, transport, de-manufacture and recycle electronic wastes until a contract is awarded.
3. Electronic wastes were collected by the City staff at 7 remote sites from November 16 2002 to March 3, 2003 in conjunction with Household Hazardous Waste Collection. Two City employees and one Mini-Van were then dedicated to the collection of E-Waste. A local service provider did a collection event in March 31, 2003.
4. Plans were made to conduct fourteen (14) remote collection events. Data collection includes the customer survey and on-site inventory. One city staff member is tasked to maintain the database that is required to substantiate the quarterly reports. See attached summary of collected electronic wastes and the summary of customer survey.
5. A one-hour training outline was developed to familiarize the staff with the FDEP Grant/Agreement Requirements, Project Work Plan, NEPSI Inventory/Report guidelines, related safety topics and hazards when working with E-Waste.
6. See the attached samples of the schedule, site, staffing and loading plans.
7. Returned herewith is the original copy of FDEP Agreement No. S0067 with required signatures.

Problems Encountered and Problem Resolution

1. Due diligence on behalf of the City contributed to the delay in issuing of the Request for Proposal and/or awarding a contract. In the interim, this issue was resolved by the procurement of services from a local vendor under a purchase order.
2. The city does not own a mobile or portable scale that is suitable for weighing the wastes. This was resolved by requiring that the service provider include the weight of the waste in the invoice.
3. Due to the delay of the awarding of the contract, the customer survey was not conducted from October 2002 to January 2003. The city staff collected the customer surveys starting on February 8, 2003.
4. The 1st and 2nd quarterly reports were postponed until after the contract between the State and the City was signed. This report covers the first and second quarters.

Schedule Updates

1. Three more remote collection events are proposed as additions to the annual plan. Please see the attached schedule.

1. Follow up on the plan to donate re-useable and/or remanufactured computers through JazWIS, Jacksonville Urban League and Jack's Recycling.

PROSTATE CANCER

RISK FACTORS

Age: More than 75% of all prostate cancers are diagnosed in men over 65.

Family History: Men whose relatives have had prostate cancer are considered to be high risk. Having a father or brother with the disease doubles your risk. Therefore, screening for prostate cancer should begin at age 40.

Race: African Americans have the highest incidence of prostate cancer. They are 30-50% more likely to get it than any other race in America.

Diet: Research suggests that high dietary fat may be a contributing factor. Also, research suggests that a diet high in calcium and low in fructose (fruit sugar) increases prostate cancer risk.

Male Hormones: High levels of male hormones called Androgens may increase the risk for some men.

Sedentary Lifestyle: Getting regular exercise and maintaining your optimal weight may reduce the risk for prostate cancer.

POSSIBLE SYMPTOMS

Frequent urination (especially at night).

Inability to urinate.

Trouble starting to urinate or trouble holding back urination.

Pain during ejaculation.

A weak or interrupted urine flow.

Pain or a burning feeling during urination.

Blood in the semen or in the urine.
