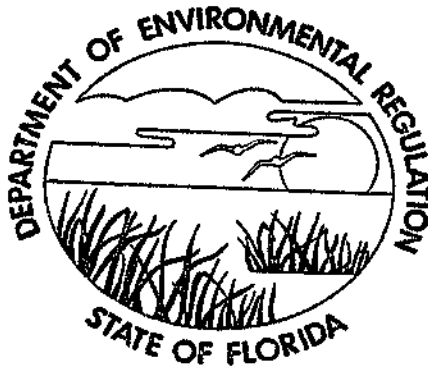

INTRODUCTION
