



Additional Information and Drawing Checklist

Boat Ramp

Boat Ramps are sloping structures on the shoreline of a water body that are used for launching small vessels, usually from a trailer

Use this checklist to check your application for completeness. Make sure all applicable information is included. This checklist is intended to supplement, not replace, the general information requirements outlined in Sections D and E of the Joint Application.

Written Description (use additional sheets if needed)

- ☐ Number of intended users of the ramp, estimate if necessary
- ☐ Whether the ramp is public or private
- ☐ Material to be used as a base and surface fill
- ☐ Existing condition of the shoreline
- ☐ Method and equipment to be used during dredging and construction
- ☐ Dredged material disposal plan, including description of any confining berms or spoil cells

****** Water quality testing, sediment testing and a hydrographic study may be required for this project. Contact your local district office to schedule a pre-application meeting. Do not begin any testing without consulting the district office.

Drawing Items (to be included in addition to general drawing requirements listed in the General Checklist)

- ☐ Length, width and depth of the structure
- ☐ Area and cubic yards of material to be dredged
- ☐ Location of any spoil disposal site for dredged material
- ☐ Details of disposal site for dredged material

- ☐ Mean/ordinary high water line
- ☐ Mean/ordinary low water line
- ☐ Offshore water depths from the ramp out to navigable water (-4 ft. MLW), on 1 ft contours
- ☐ Label the distance to navigable depth
- ☐ Location of any adjacent docks or upland structures
- ☐ Turbidity control methods
