



Additional Information and Drawing Checklist

Channel

(Includes maintenance dredging)

A Channel is a trench, with the bottom and both sides normally below water.

Construction of a new channel will require regulatory permits from the DEP and US Army Corps of Engineers, and will require a State-owned submerged lands easement.

Use this checklist to check your application for completeness. Make sure all applicable information is included. This checklist is intended to supplement, not replace, the general information requirements outlined in Sections D and E of the Joint Application.

Written Description (use additional sheets if needed)

- ☐ Describe project purpose
- ☐ If maintenance dredging, provide a copy of the previous permit or if there was no permit issued, copies of the original drawings of record showing the design specifications. Tell when and how much of the original work was completed
- ☐ Describe methods to prevent sediments and contaminants from being released into jurisdictional waters
- ☐ Provide spoil disposal details for dredged material

****** Water quality testing, sediment testing and a hydrographic study may be required for this project. Contact your local district office to schedule a pre-application meeting. Do not begin any testing without consulting the district office.

Drawing Items (to be included in addition to general drawing requirements listed in the General Checklist)

- ☐ Length, width, depth, and side slopes of the proposed channel, include depth at several locations along the length of the channel, referenced to NGVD
- ☐ Show locations of any submerged vegetation in the area

- ☐ Spoil disposal plans and details
- ☐ Location of turbidity, erosion and sedimentation controls
- ☐ Show selected testing locations on the project drawings (contact district office for location selections)

Note:

Special manatee awareness precautions may be required by the regulatory agencies. A list of common requirements is provided in Appendix E.
