Dear Mr. Oven:

Based on Florida Department of Revenue guidelines, I am submitting the following information on behalf of the Suwannee American Cement Company for your review to consider the following structures as mandated pollution control equipment. Certain buildings were mandated to be installed by FDEP Permit 121045-001-AC, PSD-FL-259 for emission control purposes.

Section II of the permit entitled *Facility-Wide Specific Conditions* addresses Emission Limiting Standards. At Specific Condition 10 of Section II, *Unconfined Emissions of Particulate Matter*, the permit states at Subsection (c):

Additional reasonable precautions applicable to this facility are:

All materials [limestone, sand, clay, flyash, gypsum and other additives that may be used], coal and petroleum coke at the plant shall be stored under roof on compacted clay or concrete, or in enclosed vessels.

(Clarification and emphasis added)

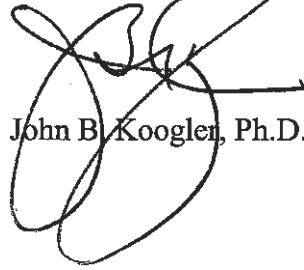

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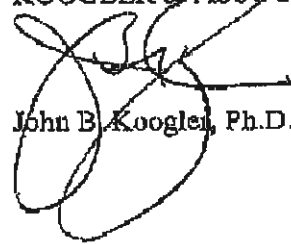

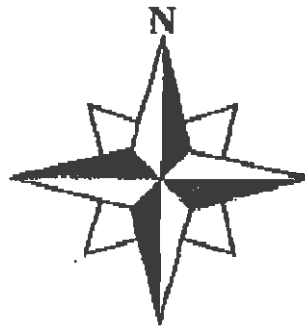

Dear Mr. Tinker:

Suwannee American Cement (SAC) was issued a Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) construction permit (Permit No. 1210465-001-AC, PSD-FL-259) on November 19, 1999. Plant operations did not begin until February of 2003.

Included in this is the following requirement.

Section II. Facility Wide Conditions. Condition 18 Unconfined Emissions of Particulate Matter (Rule 62-274.120(6)(c), F.A.C. and EACT):
All materials, coal and petroleum coke at the plant shall be stored under roof on compacted clay or in enclosed vessels.

This condition is included for minimization of fugitive dust from the facility to reduce Particulate Matter (PM) emissions.
