Beneficial Reuse of Ash

Dear Mr. Dee:

The Department has received your letter dated June 27, 2014 concerning the beneficial reuse of ash generated at the Indiantown Cogeneration L.P. (ICLP). Your letter correctly references the Conditions of Certification which require the facility to “endeavor to recycle the Project’s combustion wastes where practicable”

Historically, ICLP has provided fly ash for beneficial use to a residuals management facility owned by Florida N-Viro, L.P. located in Volusia County at the Tomoka Farms Road Landfill. The Department confirmed that it had no objection to this beneficial reuse in a letter dated April 22, 2004.

Currently, ICLP would like to send its fly ash to a Florida N-Viro Facility located in Bradley, Florida. Florida N-Viro has a Department issued Domestic Wastewater Facility Permit (FLA837067) for operation. Therefore the Department has no objection to the delivery of fly ash from the ICLP to the Florida N-Viro Facility located in Bradley, Florida.
