Project Description
The Key Biscayne Beach Nourishment Project is a 1.3-mile project between DEP monuments R101 and R108 in Miami-Dade County. The project was restored as a federally-authorized restoration in 1987. In 1990, the project was de-authorized and was subsequently followed by four non-federal nourishments in 2002, 2008, 2012, and 2017. The most recent nourishment was completed in 2021 to address damages caused by Hurricane Irma. The requested funds are for the engineering design of the next truck haul nourishment event that is scheduled for 2025. Staff have determined that 91.46% of the project is eligible for state cost sharing.
