Subject Application:

Note that this application is for a subset of the work associated with the overall project, described below, and is limited to the Sarasota County portion of the project and post-construction sea turtle monitoring.

Except for sea turtle monitoring, construction and post-construction project costs are addressed through an interlocal agreement with Charlotte County. Sea turtle monitoring is conducted through the Coastal Wildlife Club by members holding a permit from the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, which is specific to Sarasota County. There is one permit for the Sarasota County portion of the beach and another for the Charlotte County portion, which necessitated each county directly procuring monitoring services. Since Sarasota directly procured and paid for the monitoring services Charlotte County may not submit BMFA reimbursement requests on Sarasota County's behalf. To date, Sarasota County has costs for this work as follows:

Overall Project:

The overall Project includes providing erosion control and shoreline stabilization measures including beach nourishment, maintenance dredge bypassing, and stabilizing structures for over eight miles of eroding gulf and inlet shorelines within the Manasota barrier islands located both in Sarasota County and Charlotte County. The northern Project Boundary is located at Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Reference Monument (R-monument) R-173.4 in Sarasota County, extending south along Manasota Key for 1.91 miles, including the Blind Pass Beach Park, to the Charlotte/Sarasota County line at R-183.7, less a 0.60-mile GAP between R-177.5 and R-180.7, for a total length in Sarasota County of 1.31 miles. The Project continues from R-1 in Charlotte County, extending south along Manasota Key for 3.84 miles, including the Englewood Beach Park and Stump Pass Beach State Park, to Stump Pass, less a 0.24-mile GAP between R-13.2 and R-14.4, for a total length in Charlotte County of 3.60 miles. The Project extends south on Palm-Knight-Bocilla-Don Pedro Islands, extending from approximately 1,200 feet northeast of R-22 along Stump Pass' southern inlet shoreline and then along the gulf-front shoreline to the southern Project Boundary located approximately 500 feet south of R-40, equal to 3.57 miles. The total length of the shoreline within the Project boundary is approximately 44,787 feet, exclusive of the GAPS. The total length of shoreline within the Project boundary that is designated critically eroding by FDEP is approximately 38,423 feet (R-173.4 to R-21.2, 500 feet of inlet shoreline, and R-28 to R-40.5).

The specific portion of the project that is the subject of this local government funding request is R-173.4 in Sarasota County, extending south along Manasota Key for 1.91 miles, including the Blind Pass Beach Park, to the Charlotte/Sarasota County line at R-183.7, less a 0.60-mile GAP between R-177.5 and R-180.7, for a total length in Sarasota County of 1.31 miles.

The overall Project has been deemed eligible to participate in the BMFA Program. Sarasota County has successfully supported Charlotte County's application for funding in Fiscal Years (FY) 2019-2020, FY 2020-2021, FY 2021-2022, and FY 2022-2023. Previous Program awards for the Project will fund up to 35.65% of eligible costs.

Monitoring:

With the exception of sea turtle monitoring, construction and post-construction project costs are addressed through an interlocal agreement with Charlotte County. Sea turtle monitoring is conducted through the Coastal Wildlife Club by members holding permits from the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. There is one permit for the Sarasota County portion of the beach and another for the Charlotte County portion, which necessitated each county directly procuring monitoring services. Since Sarasota directly procured and paid for monitoring services Charlotte County may not submit BMFA reimbursement requests on Sarasota County's behalf. To date, Sarasota County has incurred costs of \$68,600 for FY'20, \$68,600 for FY'21, \$75,600 for FY'22, and \$75,600 (projected) for FY'23.

DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION FOR
PARTIAL FUNDING OF THE MANASOTA KEY BEACH
RESTORATION PROJECT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024**

WHEREAS, the beaches of Sarasota County are an important and valuable public resource that provides unique recreational opportunities for residents, attracts significant numbers of seasonal visitors and tourists with a resulting positive impact on the local economy, buffers upland development and public infrastructure from the effects of damaging storms and is the habitat for a variety of native wildlife and vegetation; and,

WHEREAS, the southern portion of Manasota Key has experienced severe and progressive beach erosion, which has led to the erosion of the public recreational beach, threatened area roads, and utilities, left residences vulnerable to storm damage, necessitated consideration of extensive coastal armoring, and destroyed dune habitat, all to the extent that this portion of Manasota Key is designated as an area of Critical Erosion by the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, proactive management, restoration where necessary, and timely future maintenance of the beaches in Sarasota County is clearly in the public interest of all County residents; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners authorized staff to partner with Charlotte County and to successfully undertake the construction of the Manasota Key Beach Restoration Project; and

WHEREAS, permit-required sea turtle monitoring services were procured directly by each County due to the geographical limits of the monitoring permits issued by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission; and

WHEREAS, Charlotte County is unable to submit Beach Management Funding Assistance Program reimbursement requests for costs incurred directly by Sarasota County; and

WHEREAS, Section 161.101, Florida Statutes, as implemented by Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Rules, authorizes the FDEP to pay up to 50% of qualifying costs associated with the development and implementation of erosion control, beach restoration and maintenance measures, depending on the degree of public access.

BE IT RESOLVED by the **BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARASOTA COUNTY, FLORIDA**, in public meeting assembled that:

The Board of County Commissioners supports maintenance and monitoring of the recently restored beaches consistent with the requirements of Project permits and supports the submittal of a funding request to the FDEP for consideration under the FDEP Beach Management Funding Assistance Program for Fiscal Year 2023-2024.
