Project Description
The Hillsboro-Deerfield Beach Nourishment Project is located between DEP monuments R5+350 in the City of Deerfield Beach and R9 in the Town of Hillsboro Beach in Broward County. The roughly 7000 ft long shoreline first experienced restoration in 1972. Placement has occurred in different sections of the critically eroded beach between R-monuments 5 and 12. Dredging projects occurred in 1972, 1998, 2011 and 2023. Smaller scale truck haul projects were constructed in 2008, 2015, 2018 and 2020. In October 2020, the two municipalities agreed to end ongoing litigation and collaboratively manage their adjacent coastlines through the acceptance of a Settlement Agreement, which included the periodic renourishment of the shoreline every five years. The requested funds are for post-construction monitoring for the 2023 project. Staff have determined that 100% of the project is eligible for state cost sharing.
