Project Description
The South Amelia Island Beach Nourishment project consists of the nourishment and maintenance of 3.6 miles of shoreline between DEP Monuments R-60 and R-80 located on South Amelia Island in Nassau County. Restoration of the shoreline occurred in 1994 using offshore sand sources, with nourishments occurring in 2002 and 2011. Dredging of the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway through Nassau Sound with dredge material placement partially nourished the southern end of the project in 1997, 2001, 2006, and 2013. Stabilization of the southern end of the project necessitated construction of a terminal rock groin and offshore breakwater in 2004. Project monitoring between 2005 and 2017 has indicated that the structures have performed as designed and that no adverse impacts have occurred to resources within Nassau Sound. The Project was then significantly impacted by both Hurricanes Matthew and Irma. The fourth nourishment of project was completed in January 2022. The funds requested are post construction monitoring. Staff have determined a state cost share of 83.8%
