

RESOLUTION R-24-157

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MANATEE COUNTY FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT TO FILE A LONG-RANGE BEACH EROSION CONTROL BUDGET PLAN WITH THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION; SUPPORTING THE PROJECT FOR WHICH FUNDING IS REQUESTED; CONFIRMING MANATEE COUNTY'S ABILITY TO SERVE AS LOCAL SPONSOR FOR PROJECTS AND THE COUNTY'S ABILITY TO FUND THE APPROPRIATE LOCAL SHARE OF PROJECTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Natural Resources projects and studies relating to beach erosion control, beach preservation marine environmental protection, and hurricane protection are eligible for state funding consideration under the provisions of Chapter 161, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, in order to qualify for State of Florida beach project funding, current State of Florida policy requires submission of a long-range beach erosion control plan by the local government entity which coordinates a county's beach erosion control program; and

WHEREAS, beach erosion control projects in Segment 11 (along the Gulf Coast of Anna Maria Island, encompassing the cities of Anna Maria, Holmes Beach and Bradenton Beach and including management of the adjacent inlets, Longboat Pass and Passage Key Inlet, as potential sediment sources) have been and are planned to be conducted by Manatee County as local project sponsor, with subsequent reimbursement of the federal and state shares of the eligible costs; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County has determined that it is in the best interest of Manatee County to pursue all available funding in order to restore and maintain the beaches of Manatee County;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Background Discussion

Manatee County participates with the State of Florida and the federal government to cost share for beach renourishment as the local sponsor for beach renourishment on Anna Maria Island. Each year, the State of Florida prepares a long-range beach management budget for all eligible and anticipated projects along the state coastline. As part of the application process, a current and updated resolution is required for the eligible government entity, which includes statements of their support of the projects, willingness to serve as local sponsor, and a statement of the extent of their ability and willingness to provide the necessary local funding to implement the project.

The resolution identifies the source of the matching funds as the Tourist Development Tax. This information, along with the other application materials currently being prepared by the County's consultant, Coastal Protection Engineering, is used by the State to prioritize and rank project for funding. Manatee County has been successful in the past in securing funding to match local expenditures from the dedicated One Cent Tourist Development Tax. State competition for funding remains high as Federal and State matching funds may be reduced in the future due to other national and state priorities. Attached as information items are the copies of the 2025-2026 applications.

1. Project Name: (as listed in the Strategic Beach Management Plan)

Manatee County Shore Protection Project (SPP), also referred to as the Central Beach Nourishment Project

2. Project Description: Include county, location with reference to DEP range monuments, brief project history, and description of proposed activities.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) federally authorized Manatee County Shore Protection Project (SPP) (also referred to as the Central Beach Nourishment Project) extends between R-12 and R-36.

The project was nourished originally in 1992 and has been renourished several times since. To address erosion across Anna Maria Island and impacts from Hurricane Irma, a 2020 beach nourishment project was constructed. The project was contracted by the USACE and included a federal portion (R-12 to R-36) and an "Additional Work" portion for Coquina Beach that was completed between R-34 and R-41 in November 2020. Following USACE construction, Manatee County completed a FEMA funded Coquina Beach Storm Damage Reduction Project in March 2021. The federal project is currently in the post-construction monitoring phase and physical monitoring funds are requested as part of this LGFR.

The County requested assistance from USACE to repair damages from Hurricane Idalia to the Manatee County SPP. Coordination is ongoing for a Flood Control and Coastal Emergencies (FCCE) repair project anticipated to be 100% federally funded, to be constructed pending funding approval. This project will be constructed under active FDEP Permit No. 0039378-010-JC using the authorized Passage Key sand source. Construction and post-construction monitoring funds are requested as part of this LGFR.

The "Inlet Management Study of Passage Key Inlet and Adjacent Beaches" (APTIM and CPE, 2023) was submitted to FDEP on July 19, 2023, and coordination is ongoing for adoption of the Passage Key Inlet Management Plan. Consistent with recommendations of the Inlet Management Study, next steps include Passage Key geotechnical investigations and borrow area design (funding previously requested in FY 2024/25) and permitting for future beach nourishment projects on Anna Maria Island. The County is preparing to support the County and USACE with design and regulatory authorizations for the FCCE project and funds are requested as part of this LGFR.

FDEP staff have determined that 50% of the project is eligible for state cost share.

- Manatee County has 78 trolley/bus stops on Anna Maria Island, all of which are accessible to the general public and operational year-round. The free trolley service travels daily up and down the island between Anna Maria Island and Coquina Beach, about every 20 minutes, from 6 AM to 10:30 PM.
- Lodging eligible shoreline length was truncated to not exceed the beachfront width of the property per 62B-36 guidance.

The non-federal project area extends from R-33 to R-41.5 along Coquina Beach and includes beach renourishment, stabilization projects, and associated artificial reefs constructed as mitigation. FDEP staff has determined that the non-federal projects are each eligible for 50% state cost share. The status of current non-federal projects is provided below:

Coquina Beach Nourishment:

Coquina Beach has been nourished on several occasions since 2011 using sand dredged from Passage Key Inlet and Longboat Pass maintenance dredging. Most recently, Manatee County completed the renourishment of Coquina Beach in November 2020 as "Additional Work" in collaboration with the USACE during the federally authorized Central Beach project with sand from the Passage Key ebb shoal and subsequently FEMA funded Coquina Beach Storm Damage Reduction Project in March 2021 using sand from Longboat Pass to repair damages from Hurricanes Hermine and Irma. These projects are currently in the post-construction monitoring phase.

The County is currently coordinating with FEMA for a Coquina Beach Storm Damage Repair Project (SDRP) to replace sand lost from Hurricane Idalia, to be constructed pending funding approval. Manatee County has also requested additional FEMA funding to incorporate dune plants into the restoration efforts as a strategic measure for erosion control and disaster mitigation. This project will be constructed under active permits using the authorized Longboat Pass sand source. Funds for this project are being requested as part of this LGFR with the assumption of a 75% FEMA cost share.

The "Inlet Management Study of Passage Key Inlet and Adjacent Beaches" (APTIM and CPE, 2023) was submitted to FDEP on July 19, 2023, and coordination is ongoing for adoption of the Passage Key Inlet Management Plan. Consistent with recommendations of the Inlet Management Study, next steps include Passage Key geotechnical investigations and borrow area design (funding previously requested in FY 2024/25) and permitting for future beach nourishment projects on Anna Maria Island. The County is preparing to apply for a new permit for the Coquina Beach Nourishment Project and funds are requested as part of this LGFR.

Coquina Beach Stabilization (Structures):

The existing Coquina Beach structures include 20 groins approximately 90 feet in length between R-36 and R-41. The groins have served to retain the beach fronting Gulf Drive south of 13th Street South, but their present condition is poor; the structures are degrading, losing function, and pose a hazard to the beach going community. The County completed a feasibility study in December 2021 to evaluate alternatives to rehabilitate, remove, and/or replace the Coquina Beach groins and evaluate alternative
