



**Yellow River Marsh
Preserve State Park**

Yellow River Marsh Preserve State Park is comprised of a series of parcels along the drainage of the Garcon Peninsula. The majority of the park consists of wet prairie that plays a critical role in the water quality of the adjacent aquatic preserve and downstream water bodies. No visitor facilities currently exist in the park. Improvements proposed for the park will encourage passive resource-based outdoor recreation. Recommendations for public access include a small trailhead to provide picnicking and interpretive opportunities, and the development of hiking trails to link the adjacent Northwest Florida Water Management District property, Garcon Point Water Management Area.
