St. Andrews State Park consistently ranks among the five most visited parks in the Florida State Park system and offers remarkable recreation opportunities unique to its location at the confluence of St. Andrew Bay and the Gulf of Mexico. The park yields a significant economic impact in Bay County. The identified projects on the mainland portion of the park will enhance the park's levels of service by improving access and egress through the park's use areas, provide interpretation of the park's natural and cultural resources, offer wayfinding, minimize impacts to sensitive resources, and maximize the comfort and safety of visitors.
