



Camp Helen State Park

Camp Helen State Park provides public access to a broad range of cultural and natural features of significance. Its landscape conserves intact scrub, coastal grassland, and beach dune, preserving the water quality of Lake Powell. Restored historic structures and a visitor center tell the local history of the Hicks family and Avondale Mills Retreat. Recreational opportunities in the park include swimming and fishing on the Gulf beaches, hiking along upland trails, and picnicking. Identified developments will improve the park's accessibility and provide new recreational opportunities in currently underutilized areas of the park.
