

**AMENDMENT NO. 1
TO AGREEMENT NO. CM934
BETWEEN
FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION
AND
CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE**

This Amendment to Agreement No. CM934 (Agreement) is made by and between the Department of Environmental Protection (Department), an agency of the State of Florida, and City of Fort Lauderdale, 100 N. Andrews Ave., Fort Lauderdale, FL 33301 (Grantee), on the date last signed below.

WHEREAS, the Department entered into the Agreement with the Grantee for the City's Sustainability Plan to be included as part of adaptation strategies in City plans, enhanced communication about climate change adaptation in intergovernmental coordination efforts, and partnerships with agencies and institutions to increase disaster preparedness, effective March 22, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to amend the Agreement as set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1) Attachment 3, Grant Work Plan, is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with Attachment 3-A, Revised Grant Work Plan, as attached to this Amendment and hereby incorporated into the Agreement. All references in the Agreement to Attachment 3 shall hereinafter refer to Attachment 3-A, Revised Grant Work Plan.
- 2) All other terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in effect. If and to the extent that any inconsistency may appear between the Agreement and this Amendment, the provisions of this Amendment shall control.

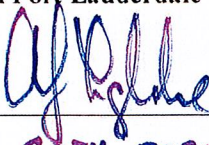

Location: Citywide

Project Summary: The City of Fort Lauderdale is a leader in addressing climate change, resilience, and peril of flood. The City's Sustainability Action Plan calls for the inclusion of adaptation strategies in City plans, enhanced communication about climate change adaptation in intergovernmental coordination efforts, and partnerships with agencies and institutions to increase disaster preparedness. Given the community's low-lying coastal location, Fort Lauderdale recognizes the potential impacts of climate change and the need for resilient approaches to stormwater management and flood hazard mitigation especially in repetitive loss areas as defined by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. This project, hereafter referred to as "Advancing Fort Lauderdale's Resilience", will develop tools and templates to complement current efforts to update the City of Fort Lauderdale Comprehensive Plan by identifying flooding concerns and proposing long-term opportunities for increasing resiliency in repetitive loss areas. Addressing climate change and its impacts is a major component of the City of Fort Lauderdale's vision for its future, as outlined in the Fast Forward Fort Lauderdale Our City Our Vision Plan. The "WE ARE READY" Vision Direction imagines that in 2035 Fort Lauderdale will be a "resilient and safe coastal community" that has effectively addressed the challenges presented by climate change.

Tasks and Deliverables

Task 1

Title: Repetitive Loss Area Analysis, Mitigation Plan, and Public Outreach Program

Description: A Repetitive Loss Area (RLA) Analysis will be conducted focusing on a cluster of seven (7) of the 89 RLAs identified in the City of Fort Lauderdale. The RLA Analysis will include approximately 400 homes for review using the five planning steps required by the Community Rating System. The analysis will be based on detailed building information collected through community feedback and field visits to understand the exact cause of repetitive flood damage in the RLA cluster. The resulting report will include analysis, findings, and development of a Mitigation Plan for the sample area, presenting the most appropriate alternatives to reduce future losses. It will also include a discussion of the challenges of performing this type of analysis with a section on lessons learned. The report will also include a list of tangible solutions and strategies to be applied in other RLAs throughout the City. Finally, the project will conclude with a program for public outreach to the neighborhood, whereby the community is presented with the findings of the study.
