In Florida, up to \$69 billion
of coastal properties currently
not at risk will likely be at risk
of flood at high tide by 2030.

By 2050, the value of
at-risk property below
local high tide levels will
rise to roughly \$152 billion.



Today, Florida has 3.5 million
people at risk of coastal flooding.
By 2050, an additional 1.1 million
people are projected to be at risk
due to sea level rise.
