Dear Ms. Mulkey:

Pursuant to Section 403.5113(1)(a), Florida Statutes and Rule 62-17.205, Florida Administrative Code, please accept this letter and attachments as a post-certification amendment to the Seminole Electric Cooperative, Inc. ("Seminole") Site Certification Application ("Application") for the Seminole Generating Station in Putnam County, Florida. This post-certification amendment addresses the extension of an asphalt road associated with the coal pile.

Seminole is requesting to pave three separate portions of an existing asphalt road that sits on the north-east corner of the coal pile. Area #1 will extend the existing road approximately 200 ft. to the south. The road will be approximately 20 ft. wide for a total area of approximately 4,000 sq. ft. Area #2 is an entryway to the hazardous waste storage area. The entryway is approximately 45 ft. x 15 ft. for a total area of 675 sq. ft. Area #3 is a service ramp into the coal yard, approximately 26 ft. x 10 ft. for a total area of 260 sq. ft. The combined area for all proposed paving is approximately 4,935 sq. ft. An aerial designating the approximate location of each area is included as Attachment A.

The existing surface for all of these areas is limerock with a compacted base. This material is similar in imperviousness to asphalt and Seminole does not expect the change to asphalt to increase significantly the runoff from these areas. Any additional runoff that may be generated will drain into an adjacent wooded upland area to the north and east of the coal pile. Runoff from the wooded area enters stormwater conveyance ditches and is directed to NPDES MSGP stormwater sampling point #7 prior to entering an on-site wetland. A map of the drainage basin that shows existing land cover is included as Attachment B.

The paving of these areas is not expected to significantly increase runoff from the property and therefore, are not expected cause any adverse environmental impacts or require any changes to the existing Conditions of Certification for the Seminole Generating Station.

If the Department concurs, Seminole requests that the Department approve the requested amendment and provide written notification of the same to Seminole, all reviewing agencies, and all parties to the original certification. 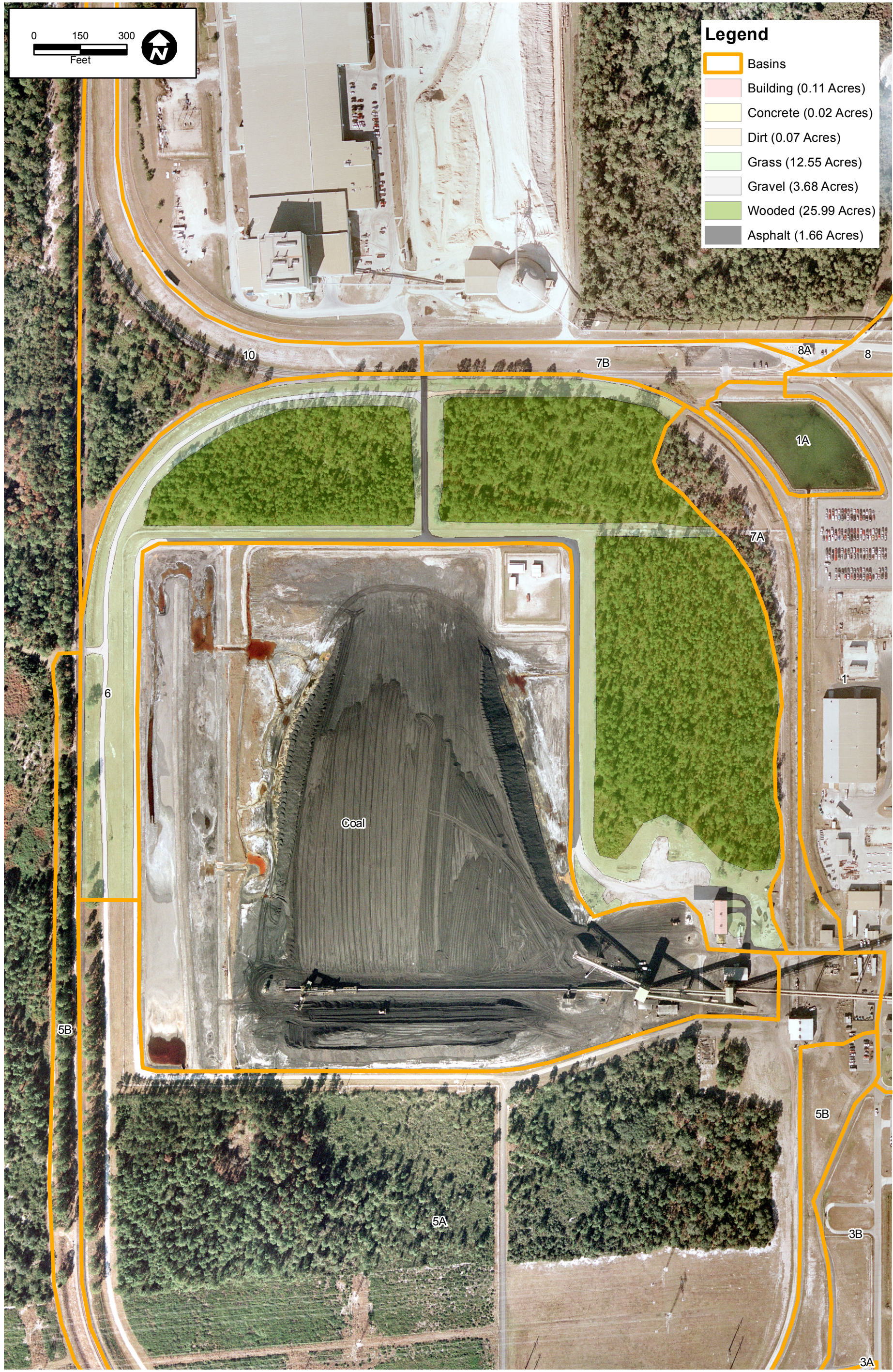


FIGURE XX.
