Dear Ms. Mulkey:

On June 30, 2009, Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) filed its Site Certification Application (SCA) for the Turkey Point Units 6 & 7 Project (Project) in Miami-Dade County, pursuant to the Florida Electrical Power Plant Siting Act, Section 403.501, et seq., Florida Statutes (F.S.). FPL responded to six rounds of completeness comments from reviewing agencies on the transmission line portion of the Project and five rounds of completeness on the plant and non-transmission portion of the Project. FPL also submitted amendments to the SCA (Rev. 1) on May 14, 2010 and (Rev. 2) on November 15, 2012. The Department has determined both the transmission line and the plant and non-transmission portions of the SCA to be complete. Part of the SCA Amendment (Rev. 2) submitted on November 15, 2012, included a revised groundwater model. This SCA amendment (Rev. 3) makes minor revisions to the groundwater model report.

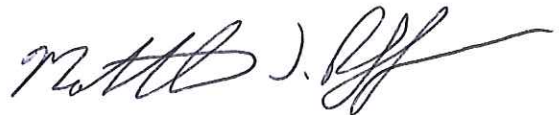
The enclosed report (Groundwater Model Development and Analysis: Units 6 & 7 Dewatering and Radial Collector Well Simulations, Revision 3, December 2012), provides minor revisions to two approach velocity values presented for the radial collector wells "RCW in the Key Largo Limestone" sensitivity case in Table 12. These changes are the result of a correction to the model input/output files for this case. There are no changes to the base case approach velocities and the model conclusions with this correction. The base case was used for the environmental impact analysis presented in the SCA and completeness responses. Therefore, this amendment does not affect the environmental impact analysis or conclusions presented in the SCA and completeness responses.

The Groundwater Flow Model for Biscayne Aquifer-Calculation Input/Output Files (Revision 007) (5 CDs) containing the input and output files for the revised groundwater model will be provided to Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Siting Coordination Office, the FDEP Southeast District, the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) and Miami-Dade County (MDC) under separate cover. A copy of the input and output files will be made available to other agencies upon request.

Enclosed please find an electronic copy (CD) of this SCA Amendment showing the relevant changes to Revision 2 of the Groundwater Model Development and Analysis: Units 6 & 7 Dewatering and Radial Collector Well Simulations report. We have also issued an electronic copy (CD) of this SCA Amendment to each person (or their replacement) who received a hard copy or an electronic copy (CD) of FPL's SCA in the original distribution (as reflected on the attached distribution list).
