Important information about a Progress Energy Florida power plant project in your community

Dear Property Owner:

Progress Energy Florida is planning for new electric equipment to serve our growing state. As you may know, the company announced the potential to build a nuclear plant with two units at a proposed site in Levy County.

The proposed site in Levy County is about 3,100 acres, located about seven miles inland from the Gulf of Mexico and eight miles north of the company's Crystal River Energy Complex in Citrus County. The proposed plant would occupy about 300 acres of the site. **Your property (parcel number above) is within three miles of the site.**

Florida law requires Progress Energy to notify all property owners within three miles of the site about its application for approval under Florida's Electrical Power Plant Siting Act.

Progress Energy Florida submitted a Site Certification Application, which included a map (attached) showing the site of the proposed plant, to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP). If the company decides to move forward, and plans are approved by state and federal regulators, construction of the new plant could begin around 2010, with the nuclear units entering service in 2016 and 2017, respectively.
